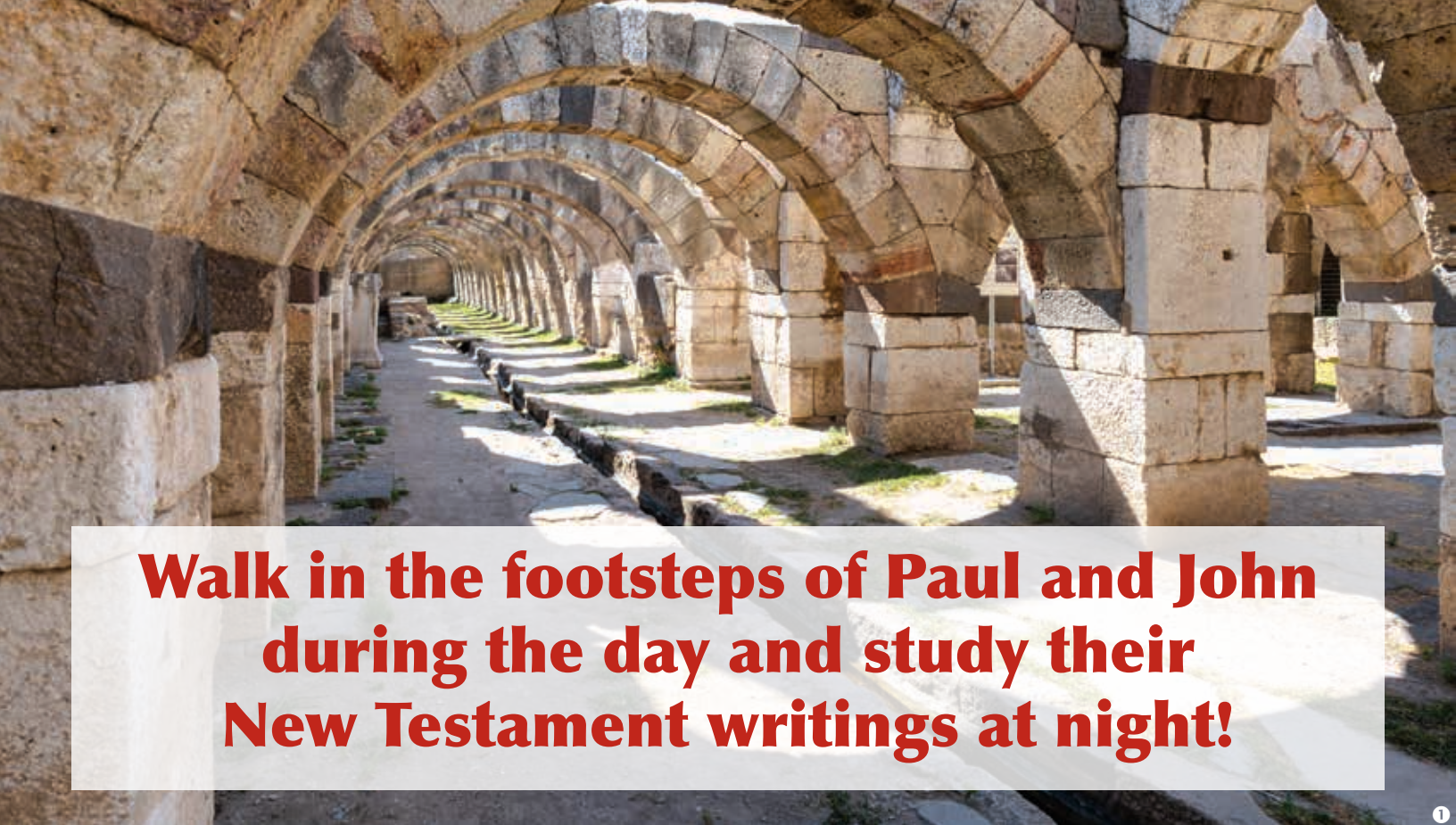

### OCTOBER 2026

#### Friday, October 9 Departure

Our biblical study tour begins! Before it is possible to follow in the steps of Paul and John, we must first travel to Turkey. We meet early in the morning at the Chicago O'Hare International Airport to check in for our transatlantic flight to Istanbul (other departure cities available upon request). (D-in flight)

#### Saturday, October 10 Arrive in Izmir

After changing planes in Istanbul, we arrive in Izmir (ancient Smyrna), which is now the third largest city in Turkey. We board our waiting bus and transfer to the hotel for a few hours of rest. In the late afternoon, we have our first site visit. Located very near our hotel in the heart of the modern city of Izmir are the remains of ancient Smyrna. Here we see the ancient agora (open commercial area) with its two-storied stoas (covered sidewalks), basilica (large public building), and crypto-porticos, thereby giving us a glimpse of Smyrna's glorious past. We hear and reflect on the meaning of Christ's commendatory sermon to the Christians in Smyrna who were persevering in the faith despite persecution (Rev. 2:8-11). If possible, we also drive up to Mt. Pagus (now called Kadifekale or "Velvet Castle"), which is the acropolis of ancient Smyrna. From here, we have a great view of the modern city of Izmir and its important harbor. We then return to our hotel for our first study session, a delicious meal, and a night of well-deserved rest. (B, D)



#### Sunday, October 11 Pergamum, Soma

We drive two hours north to Pergamum today, one of the most impressive archaeological sites in all of Turkey. We take a gondola ride to the top of its acropolis where we see many ancient monuments: a 10,000-seat theater that is the steepest in the ancient world; the magnificently restored temple of the Roman emperor Trajan; a library that originally housed 200,000 volumes, second in size only to the library in Alexandria; the base of the massive Altar of Zeus (now removed and reassembled in the Pergamum Museum in Berlin); and the temple of the "party-god" Dionysus. After descending from the acropolis, we visit the "Red Court"—a temple to the Egyptian

gods who were increasing in popularity in New Testament times. Finally, we visit the medical center of the healing god Asclepius with its own theater, library, underground tunnel, healing center, and other buildings. Christ both commends some in the church here for being faithful despite living in a place of "Satan's throne," but also warns others in the church of how they have compromised their faith and are guilty of idolatry (Rev. 2:12-17). We make the short drive to our hotel in Soma for a worship service/study session focuses on Christ's sermon to Pergamum. (B, D)

**Monday, October 12**  
**Sardis, Miletus, Didyma,**  
**Kuşadası**

We have two visits today: the first relates to John and the Book of Revelation; the second with Paul and the Book of Acts. We begin by driving south to the ancient city of Sardis. Here we see the remains of the magnificent temple of Artemis, the beautifully reconstructed gymnasium and public baths, the largest known synagogue from the ancient world, and Byzantine-era shops that testify to the presence of a Christian community. In this unique setting, we get a better appreciation of Christ's warning sermon to his followers in Sardis, who are judged by the Lord to be spiritually dying, if not already dead (Rev. 3:1-6). We then drive further south to Miletus, which, due to its four harbors and strategic location on the Aegean coast of Asia Minor, became one of the great cities

of commerce in the ancient world. The most impressive of the surviving buildings is a 15,000-seat theater. Paul stopped in Miletus on the return leg of his Third Missionary Journey, where he summoned the elders from Ephesus to meet with him and hear his poignant farewell speech (Acts 20:17-35). Some 12 miles away, connected by the Sacred Road, was Didyma, not a city but a religious site devoted to the god Apollo. The temple built in his honor here was most remarkable, consisting of 122 columns that are six feet in diameter and reach six stories high. Although only three full columns have survived, the remaining stunted columns demonstrate why this shrine was a notable rival to the famous temple of Apollo at Delphi, with its renowned oracle. End the day by driving north to spend the next two nights in the scenic port city of Kuşadası. (B, D)

**Tuesday, October 13**  
**Ephesus, Kuşadası**

Today may well be the high note of the tour, as we visit the most impressive biblical site of our trip: Ephesus. The former glory of this city can still be easily appreciated today due to its well-preserved streets, temples, fountains, public baths, terraced houses, and theatres. Ephesus was also the site of the Artemis temple — one of the seven wonders of the ancient world. There is also the same theatre where some 24,000 citizens of Ephesus gathered, shouting, "Great is Artemis of the Ephesians!" in a riot started in response to Paul's ministry there. The apostle visited this city only briefly during his second missionary journey (Acts 18:18-21) but returned during his third missionary journey for a much longer period of two years and three months (Acts 19:1-20:1). Timothy later served as pastor in this city during which time Paul wrote him two letters (1 & 2 Timothy). Some years later, Ephesus served as the home base for the apostle John's ministry from where he wrote a number of letters (1, 2, 3 John) and to which he sent the Book of Revelation. In addition to the ancient city, we also visit the "slope houses," the wealthiest homes in Ephesus that have been marvelously reconstructed. We enjoy a complimentary lunch at the Carpet Weaving Center as well as an interesting demonstration of how Turkish carpets are made. Afterward, we visit the Ephesus Museum, which, though small, houses several impressive items from this site. Finally, we make a brief stop at the Basilica of St. John, which houses the apostle's tomb. We spend another night in the beautiful seaside port city of Kuşadası, where our study session focuses on Christ's sermon to the Ephesian church (Rev. 2:1-7). (B, L, D)

**Wednesday, October 14**  
**Aphrodisias, Laodicea,  
Pamukkale**

We drive inland east, following the Meander Valley to the marvelously preserved ancient city of Aphrodisias. This Roman city includes a 30,000-seat stadium, baths, a bouleuterion (city hall), a 7,000-seat theater, two agoras, and the temple of Aphrodite, after whom the city is named. Perhaps the most important of the surviving buildings, though, is the Sebasteion—the building devoted to the Roman Empire and its emperors. The parallel porticoes facing each other and separated by a paved processional way were three stories high and contained some 200 life-sized reliefs that were intended to celebrate Roman power and victory over the world. Although this city is not mentioned in the Bible, it gives us a very clear window into what life was like in many cities scattered around the ancient Mediterranean world where Paul, John, and other apostles spread the good news of the gospel. We then drive further east to visit the first of the “Tri-cities” of the Lycus Valley: Laodicea. This was a major city in New Testament times, as is clear from not only the size of the ancient site but also its multiple agoras (shopping areas), two theatres, stadium, aqueduct, and a major street lined with shops. Laodicea is not only the last (and worst!) of the seven churches to whom Christ addresses a sermon (Rev. 3:14-22), but it also had a close relationship with the nearby churches of Colossae and Hierapolis (Col. 4:13-15) and was the recipient of one of Paul’s now lost letters (Col. 4:16). We overnight in nearby Pamukkale where our hotel contains thermal baths both inside and outside. Be sure to bring your bathing suit so that you can enjoy the healing qualities of these thermal baths, which were already famous in NT times. (B, D)



**Thursday, October 15**  
**Hierapolis, Colossae, Antalya**

We begin the day by visiting the second of the “Tri-cities” of the Lycus Valley: Hierapolis. With its hot springs that were well-known in the ancient world for their medicinal qualities as well as the city’s spectacular white travertine terraces, Hierapolis remains just as popular with travelers today as it was in biblical times. Equally impressive, however, are the remains of the ancient city: the Plutonium (a temple dedicated to Pluto or Hades, the god of the underworld); a 20,000-seat theater; the Triple Arch city gate dedicated to the emperor Domitian; ancient baths; the largest ancient graveyard in Asia Minor containing more than 1,200 tombs, tumuli, and sarcophagi; and the Martyrium of St.

Philip, a 5th century AD structure on the site where the apostle Philip was killed and whose tomb was recently discovered. After a short drive, we then have a brief visit to the third of the “Tri-cities”: Colossae. Our visit will be brief because this site has unfortunately not yet been excavated. Nevertheless, this is an important site for contemporary Christians to visit, since Paul sent two letters here: one to the church of Colossae and one to the rich Christian slave-owner Philemon, who hosted the Colossian church in his home. We then have a longer drive south to the Mediterranean coastline to spend the next two nights in Antalya (ancient Attalia visited by Paul on his first missionary journey). We end the day with another delicious dinner. (B, D)





**Friday, October 16**

### **Perge, Aspendos, Antalya**

We begin by visiting the nearby ancient city of Perge, where Paul, Barnabas, and John Mark landed after sailing from the island of Cyprus during the first missionary journey (Acts 14:13-14). Perge was a wealthy city, as can still easily be seen today from its 15,000-seat theatre, 12,000-seat stadium, Hellenistic gate with its “Twin Towers,” baths with under-floor heating, pillared marketplace, water fountains, and beautiful colonnaded street with a flowing water channel in the middle. A little further east is Aspendos, impressive for both its magnificent aqueduct and its 20,000-seat theatre, the best preserved in the whole of Turkey. We then drive back to Antalya, which in Paul’s day was known as Attalia and was the place from where the apostle and Barnabas sailed home at the end of the first missionary

journey (Acts 14:25). In the heart of the old town of Antalya, we have time for a late lunch at the St. Paul Cultural Center—a “coffee shop” run by Christians that more importantly also serves as home to two churches: one Turkish and the other international. Here we plan to visit with a Turkish pastor who will share what it is like to live as a Christian in a country where 99.9% of its citizens are Muslim. We also hope to meet with Dr. Mark Wilson, an American evangelical NT scholar, who lives full-time in Turkey and has written the best guide to Jewish and Christian sites in Asia Minor. Afterward, we have a walking tour in the quaint restored area of the old harbor, also enjoying the view of the very same port from which Paul and Barnabas sailed on the return leg of their missionary trip. The day ends with another optional study session on “Paul: His Life & His Letters.” (B, D)



**Saturday, October 17**

### **Pisidian Antioch, Iconium, Konya**

Today will be a long but rewarding day. We begin by enjoying a scenic drive north over the Taurus Mountains to a very important city that Paul and Barnabas visited on the first missionary journey: Antioch of Pisidia (not to be confused with Antioch on the Orontes, from where the apostle began each of his major missionary journeys). Archaeological excavations have uncovered the remains of a thriving city, complete with a theater, imperial temple, stadium, baths, water fountains, paved streets, and aqueduct. This Antioch is where Acts records Paul giving a powerful, lengthy sermon to local Jews in the synagogue (Acts 13:14-52). This Antioch included Christians to whom Paul later wrote in his letter to the Galatians. We visit both the ruins of the ancient city as well as its small museum in the nearby village of Yalvaç, which contains the important Sergius Paulus inscription and the famous “Res Gestae” inscription of Caesar Augustus—one of only three extant copies. We then drive east to Konya, known in the ancient world as Iconium. This was a key place where Paul ministered not only on his first missionary journey (Acts 14:1-7), but almost certainly on his second and third missionary journeys as well (Acts 16:6; 18:23). We stop briefly at Alaeddin Tepesi (“Alaeddin Hill Park”)—the current location of one of the oldest mosques in the city, but more importantly, the acropolis of ancient Iconium. The columns in the mosque date back to Roman times and so connect us to the ministry of Paul in this city. Our day concludes in Konya with good food and fellowship. (B, D)



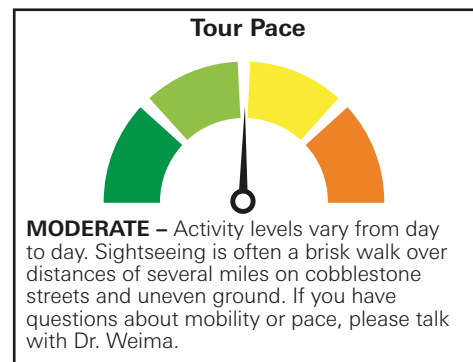
## Sunday, October 18 Cappadocia

We spend our morning on the road, driving to the remarkable region of Cappadocia. Here is where the erosion of soft volcanic stone has created bizarre yet beautiful geological formations—rock cones, capped pinnacles, stark ravines, and steep precipices. The Göreme Valley, declared by UNESCO to be a World Heritage Site, contains 30 or more churches built by carving rooms out of the soft volcanic tufa. These churches date from the 9th century onwards and feature superb Byzantine frescoes of biblical and early Christian scenes. The highlight is the Dark Church, which is decorated with brilliantly colored frescoes that have been carefully preserved. We will also visit Pasabag Valley, where the mushroom-shaped fairy chimneys will provide you with a memorable photo and put a smile on your face. If time permits, we also visit the Zelve Open Air Museum, which contains 15 Byzantine-era cave churches. Although these cave churches are not as well-preserved, nice walking paths (1.5 miles) offer an opportunity to explore various cave rooms and further enjoy Cappadocia's stunning terrain. Some of the Jewish pilgrims in Jerusalem for the Day of Pentecost were from Cappadocia (Acts 2:9), and Peter's two letters were addressed to Christians who lived in this area (1 Pet. 1:1; 2 Pet. 3:1). In the 4th century AD, the so-called "Cappadocian Fathers"—Basil the Great, his brother Gregory of Nyssa, and Gregory of Nazianzus—played a key role in defeating the Arian heresy. We end today with worship and a final "debriefing" session to review together the many sites and experiences of this amazing biblical study tour. (B, D)



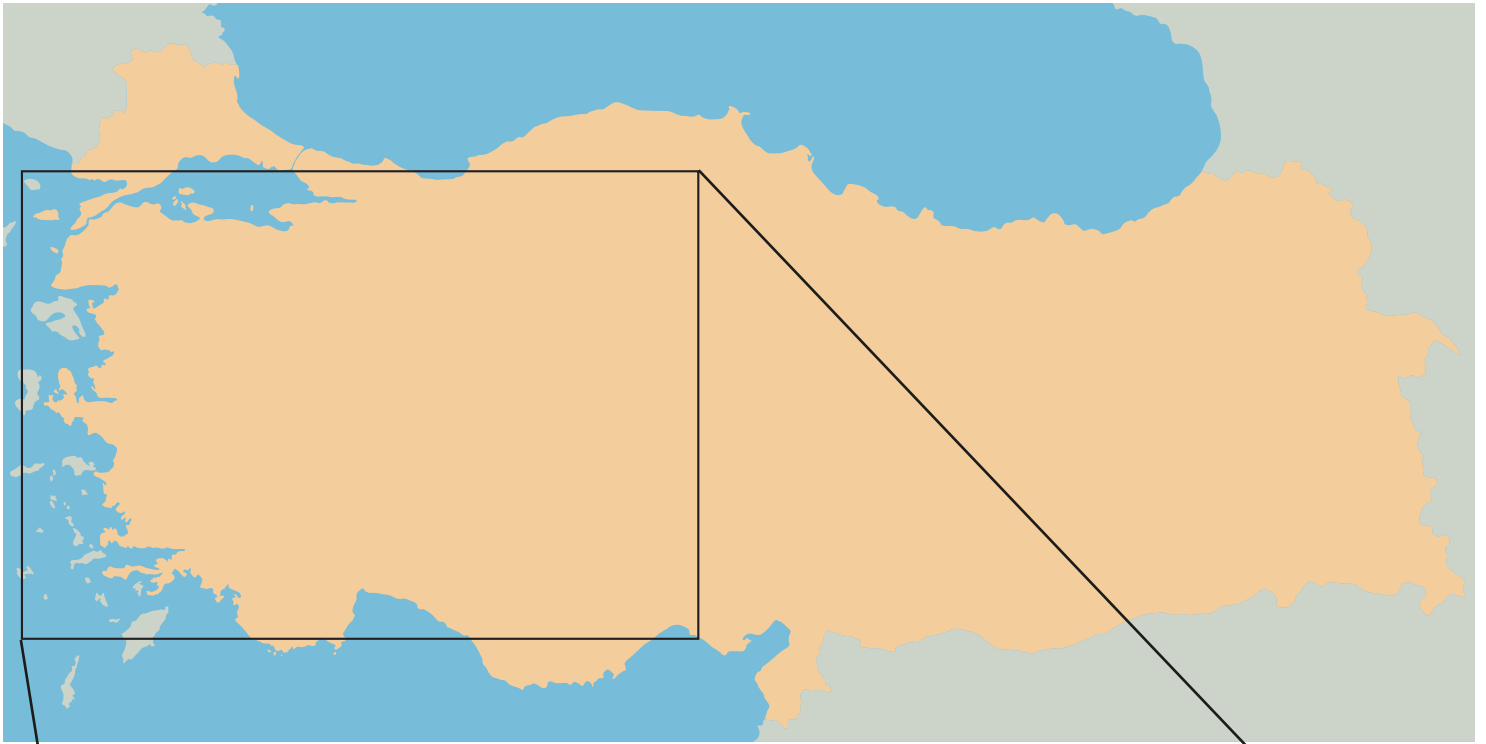
## Monday, October 19 Return

**Air transportation** from Chicago to Izmir and Nevsehir to Chicago with any regularly scheduled air carrier, based on a nonrefundable/nonchangeable fare, which requires a minimum of 10 passengers traveling round trip together. The identity of the carrier, which may include the carrier's code-share partner, will be assigned and disclosed in your final documents. Tickets are issued 45 days prior to departure. It has become increasingly necessary to possess such a note, and will save time if questions arise departing from the U.S. or to exit a foreign country. Parents who share custody of their children should carry copies of the legal custody documents. **Health Documentation Requirements.** You are responsible to make absolutely certain to have the proper immunizations and required documentation of such immunizations before travel. Witte shall not assume responsibility for the accuracy of health requirements or vaccination documentation prior to departure or upon landing at the final destination. See your health practitioner for advice. Prior to travel, required inoculations, if any, must be recorded by your health practitioner on a valid vaccination certificate, and you must carry for proof of inoculation where required. If you are concerned about taking any medications or receiving certain inoculations, and adequate timing of such inoculations relative to your travel booking, consult your health practitioner BEFORE booking. These size and weight restrictions conform to most airlines' requirements. Hand luggage does not fit in the overhead bins on the motorcoach. **Land-only participants.** If you wish to make your own flight arrangements, contact Witte for the land-only cost at least 90 days prior to departure. Participants who make their own flight arrangements are strongly encouraged to coordinate their flight schedules with the group's flight schedule and to use the same airports. The group's airport transfers on the arrival and return days will be timed to the group's flight schedule. Land-only participants may need to arrange for their own airport transfers. Contact Witte for information and costs on options for private transfers. Witte cannot be responsible for any inconveniences to land-only participants resulting from changes in the group's flight schedule. 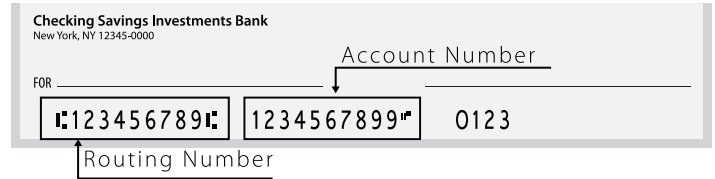
